- Created in 2013 as part of HWW Reef Rescue project
- Based on feedback from reef stakeholders
- Project team led by Dr Andrew O'Neill in partnership with Meter, Bligh Tanner and Landscapology
- Intent was to help guide discussion and decision making around urban water management
- Enshrined in state policy as a valid alternative to meeting the Stormwater Management Design Objectives (SMDOs)

- Increasing pressures on urban waterways
- Stormwater management design objectives (SMDOs) only address water quality 80/60/45
- Living Waterways balances water quality objectives with environmental, social and economic outcomes
- Flexible, site-driven, encourages innovation and integration



Applying the framework

- Brisbane residents are concerned with the health of local waterways
- Waterways are valued and provide high levels of personal benefits
- Aim was to increase opportunities for citizens to participate in nature related behaviours

CoDesign approach

- Piloted in Davidson St.
- CoDesign enables communities to become an integral part of the design process
- Involved extensive collaboration with diverse stakeholders
- Community insight and ownership was critical to project success
- Helped to forge values of stewardship and social connection


